President's Report 2022-2023

The year's activities commenced with the September opening of Art & Craft 2022 – a cash & carry fair which was moderately financially successful. The concept of 'cash & carry' proved to be a welcome change from the previous more stressful situation of taking down unsold works, whilst also attending to clients collecting purchases.

With the 2022 passing of former President Paul Rasmussen the organisation canvassed donations to cover the matting costs of four images, to become a lasting memorial to Paul. Members obviously appreciated what he had accomplished for the Hawkesbury art community & in particular our organisation, as the fund-raising initiative proved so successful we were able to cover the cost of the majority of works which formed the backbone of the memorial exhibition IMPACT to NOW. The exhibition, in the Stan Stevens Studio, opened October 29th with Jeanne Rasmussen as honoured guest and with a sizable crowd in attendance.

November 2022: Our massive weekend garage sale took place across two days with the sum of \$3,018 being raised for the financial year.

Also in November, in the Stan Stevens Studio, the exhibition Colours of Asia was held including several images from our Collections. Highlights of the exhibition included works by Craig Waddell (representing Thailand), a work on silk - artist unknown - (India) and Ron Hogan's 'Extracts from a Painters Journal' (Indonesia). The works were supported by images & crafts from member's own collections. This colourful exhibition was enhanced by our year end luncheon featuring wonderful food from the Asian continent.

This position is critical for this organisation and we are seeking a willing volunteer to undertake the role from tonight.


